

# THE FIVE PILLARS OF LENT

- 1. To reflect and remember God's love for us; how out of love He created us to share eternal life and love with Him.
- 2. To realise that our sins have blocked our experience of God's love and separate us from eternal life with Him. Lent, thus, rallies the whole community to pray for one another, to do penance in order to cast out sins and to work on removing any habits that lead to sin. One of the high points of Lent is to make a good confession towards the end of the Lenten period.
- 3. To reflect that God redeemed us from damnation to restore us to eternal life with Him. This was done through His life, suffering, death, and ultimately His Resurrection. Lent focuses on the painful sacrificial price He paid for our salvation, that's why during this period of Lent we pay special attention to remember His Passion and Crucifixion.
- 4. To remember Christ's generosity in giving His life for our salvation. Lent is also a time we are asked to be generous in return, therefore the focus on giving alms. Little wonder why "Charity Week" is always during one of the weeks in Lent.
- 5. To pray for the catechumens and elect to be baptised on Easter Sunday. Lent calls for the Church to further step up efforts to pray for them.

Above are the Five Pillars of Lent. Observing them with love is a relation we share with God. Observing them without love may only be a ritual practice or empty obligation. For God's love is never out of obligation.

Prayer for Generosity (St Ignatius of Loyola)

Lord, teach me to be generous. Teach me to serve you as you deserve;

To give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds,

To toil and not to seek for rest, to labour and not to ask for reward,

Save that of knowing that I do your will.

### **INFANT BAPTISM**

Application forms (available at the Parish Office) must be completed and submitted with relevant documents attached. Parents and godparents will be informed of the date and time of the preparatory session that they would need to attend as well as the actual date of baptism.

### **WEDDING**

Kindly register your intention to get married at the Parish Office at least 12 months before your intended date. This is to ensure that you have sufficient time to go for your marriage preparation and your celebrant is able to make the date.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the Sick can be administered to any Catholic who is awaiting serious surgery, suffers from serious illness or is weakened by old age.

Kindly contact the Parish Office to request for a priest to administer the sacrament. In emergencies, either the priests of the parish or priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.
